This "Getting Started" guide will help you determine the best products to start with, as well as give you some ideas as to what you can make with those products. The key is to start small and then build on your supplies, but make sure you can create with what you purchase. So often people buy random things, with no plan in mind, and then they are stuck without the right things to get started. We don't want that to happen to you!

## Start with a SIP - Stamps, Ink & Paper

Here is a great collection of getting start products. It will give you everything you need to create some hand-made cards without being overwhelmed.





You can make these beautiful cards with a minimum amount of supplies. You just want to make sure you get everything that you do need so that you will be able to get started once your products arrive.

These items will give you everything you need to start making cards the day your supplies arrive! One of the things that I love about the Sweet as a Peach stamp set is the variety of greeting stamps that it has. You can make cards for many different occasions. It's a great getting started stamp set!

## Want to Step it Up?

Once you have the basics, it's easy to add a few more items and "step up" your cards just a bit. The only difference in these cards is a couple of layers of cardstock.

Basic White layer: 3" x 4 ½"
Basic Black layer: 3 ½" x 4 ½"



Since you are cutting cardstock, you will also need a Paper Trimmer and some adhesive to put the layers together. Just adding these layers gives your cards a whole new look!
